West Bengal Civil Defence

About West Bengal Civil Defence Organisation

West Bengal is the only State in country to have both Himalaya and Sea Coast. We have Bay of Bengal with major rivers flowing across the state.

In last two years the state Civil Defence Organisation made remarkable progress towards revamping the set up althrough state with Spl. emphasis on Kolkata sub-area, coastal and flood- prone CD districts of State. With Bankura notified as Civil Defence district few months back, all the 19 districts of the State are now Civil Defence Districts. The CD Organaisation emerged as a vibrant organaisation from dormant stage under the robust leadership of Hon'ble MIC – Janab Javed Ahamed Khan, My immediate predecessor Shri R.J.S. Nalwa, IPS who made sincere efforts towards revival and revamping of State Civil Defence Organaisation during last two years.

After so - called Himalayan Tsunami that devastated the parts of Uttarakhand State on and after 15th of June 2013, the Govt. of West Bengal in the Civil Defence Deptt. Started working on securing the Himalayan Queen 'Darjeeling', as the Himalayan range here is equally vulnerable.

Both North and South parts of State are flood-prone and during monsoon our resources and manpower are engaged in flood rescue and relief works for almost 5 months starting from June to October. Rivers in North Bengal flowing across in Darjeeling, Cooch Behar and Jalpaiguri are known for flash-flood.

In Kolkata Sub-areas water-logging in monsoon and incidence of fire is very common. The CD Organisation with its volunteers play crucial role in rescue work during fire, water logging and Norwester, locally known as "Kalbaishakhi". The CDVs played a crucial role during AMRI Fire and Surya Sen Street Market Fire. Hon'ble CM, WB rewarded all of them in a specially organised function. DG NDRF & CD, MHA, GOI issued appreciation letters to them & DG Disc to the then Director of CD & 3 CDVs. One volunteer (Shri Dilip Mondal) has been awarded with President Medal for meritorious service on the occasion of last Independence Day.

During the financial year 2012-13, we have purchased and procured more than 44 vehicles and modern search and rescue equipments with a view to place 1 big and 1 small vehicle at each district with modern equipments. The Civil Defence Organaisation in W.B. is a vibrant and dynamic organaisation capable of handling any disasters, natural / manmade that may strike anywhere in Bengal. This could be achieved largely due to total implementation of the 100% Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Revamping of Civil Defence Set-up in the Country. Bengal has not only become the first State to move from a Town -Centric to District-Centric set-up but has taken the CD organaisation to the grassroots level by ensuring that every G.P. has 10-15 Volunteers, every Municipal Town 20 Volunteers per Ward, and every Corporation 50 Volunteers per Ward. The Civil Defence Rescue Vehicle designed by Director of Civil Defence, WB has been made the role model for the Country by DGCD. Bengal has, in fact, moved a step further and already acquired one fully equipped Heavy CDRV & one Mini CDRV for each District to be manned by a fully Trained Q.R.T. of 40 Volunteers. The Rescue & PPE&C Equipments acquired by Bengal are among the best available in the World, from Search Cams by Yone Corp, Japan, Fire entry suits by Newtex, USA, CBRN Masks with Carbon Composite Cylinders by Scott, UK, Rotary Rescue Saws and Bullet Chain Saws by STIHL, Germany, Kernmentle Ropes, Seat Harness, Carabineers, Pulleys, Gri-Gri, Stop Lock and other climbing equipments by PETZL, France, to Rope Delivery Guns & Power Ascenders / Descenders from Power Quick, India. The CCDTI, WB has been upgraded by construction of a 100 - seated state of the art Lecture Hall, a five storied Rescue Tower and a Smoke Chamber. The CD volunteers @ 60 per district have been imparted training in handling modern equipments which started from 25th May 2013 and ended on 3rd August 2013.

The disaster has become the focal point for Civil Defence Organisation with passing of Civil Defence (Amendment) Act 2009.

It is pertinent to mention here that West Bengal is having International border with three countries namely Bangladesh, Bhutan and Nepal. We have three Regional Civil Defence Control Centres. One is at Siliguri, the second is Hashimara and third and biggest one is at Kolkata. The regions covered by the RCDCC,

Kolkata are Southern part of West Bengal; whole of Odisha and Jharkhand. These RCDCC were set up in 1963 in the wake of Chinese aggression in the year 1962. The entire RCDCC existing Air — Raid warning system needs immediate revamping and replacement by a fast, efficient, reliable and cost effective system. Keeping this in view, we have floated e-tender for installation of Wireless Automated Remote Siren (WARS) System. The system is equally effective in dealing with disasters.

Initially all the Border Areas and Industrial belt were declared as CD Areas by the DGCD, MHA, GOI.

After Bangladesh liberation war 1972 many of these areas became non-CD areas. According to the latest circular in the year 1995 the following areas were declared as:-

Category - I Areas:-

Greater Kolkata and Suburb of Hooghly & 24 Parganas, Mourigram, Durgapur and Andal, Siliguri, Bagdogra and New Jalpaiguri, Haldia, Hashimara, Kharagpur and Kalaikunda, Burnpur and Asansol, Farakka & Khejuriaghat.

Category - II Areas:-

Chittaranjan, Jalpaiguri and Darjeeling.

Presently all the 19 districts including Kolkata are under Civil Defence. Recently Bankura District has been notified as CD District. In last financial year CD Directorate (GOI) has declared 10 Districts (Burdwan, Hooghly, Darjeeling, East Midnapur, Howrah, Jalpaiguri, Kolkata, Murshidabad and West Midnapur) of West Bengal as Multi Hazard Districts.

By way of conclusion, it may be mentioned here that in course of time role of CD Organaisation has undergone many changes and one of its objectives now includes Disaster Management with the Amendment by the Civil Defence Amendment Act – 2009. The Civil Defence Organaisation is now mandated to take measures before, during, at or after the time of any type of disaster.




West Bengal Civil Defence Organization

The Civil Defence set up in the State started functioning just after Indo-China war 1962. Initially all the border areas of the State and Industrial belt of West Bengal declared by the Central Authority as Civil Defence areas. But after the Bangladesh liberation war many of the areas were declared as non-CD areas. According to the latest circular, vide G.O. I/MHA No. VIII-11011/3/86-DGCD(CD) dated 10.07.87 as revised on 29.08.95, the following areas of West Bengal were declared as CD Category –I areas: Greater Calcutta, Howrah, Hooghly & 24-Parganas, Mourigram, Durgapur & Andal, Siliguri, Bagdogra and New Jalpaiguri), Haldia, Hashimara, Kharagpur where as Kalaikunda, Burnpur & Asansol, Farakka & Khejuria Ghat. Chittaranjan, Jalpaiguri and Darjeeling were declared as category-II areas.

During the war against Pakistan in 1965 and Bangladesh liberation war in 1971, the CD Organisation worked effectively by mobilising trained volunteers and by boosting the morale of the people. The local CD officers played a vital role in the functioning of refugee camps set up in different parts of West Bengal for the refugees of Bangladesh. Civil Defence services were also effectively engaged in management of flood, water logging, building collapse and railway accident etc.

Presently all the 18 districts and Kolkata area are under CD areas. Recently the Govt. of West Bengal included Bankura as CD district. We have all the services starting from Communication Service, Warden Service, Casualty Service, Rescue Service, Welfare Service, Supply Service, Depot & Transport Service & Training Service.

The CD Organisation in the state, operational part, is headed by Director of Civil Defence, an IPS officer in the rank of ADGP with office at 81/2/2 Phears Lane, Kolkata-700012. The Controller Kolkata, initially an IPS office in the rank of DIG has been replaced by an IAS officer with the introduction of Collectorate system for Kolkata. The entire Kolkata Civil Defence is divided into three Sub-Areas i.e. South, North, Central headed by Dy. Controller in the rank of Executive Magistrate. The hierarchical set-up is illustrated here:-



Changed Role of Civil Defence:

The civil Defence Act 1968, has been suitably amended by the Civil Defence (Amendment) Act 2009 by notification No. 3 of 2010, to include the Disaster Management as an additional role for the Civil Defence Corps, while retaining its primary role. Thus considering the reduce chances of war fare importance is being given to mitigate natural disaster with the minimum response time. Volunteers of different districts are being taught up with the curriculum according to the topography of their locality and neighboring districts.

WWCD, WBCEF:

- Civil Defence Organisation , West Bengal has two wings having its set up more or less on battalion pattern namely
 - Water Wing Civil Defence and (WWCD)
 - West Bengal Civil Emergency Force (WBECF)
- All these two wings are permanent bodies.

West Bengal Civil Emergency Force:

- WBCEF was raised in Feb, 1967 and stationed at Howrah Maidan Camp.
- ➡ The 2nd Company of the Force was raised in November, 1968 and was stationed at Belur Housing Estate.
- The sanctioned strength of WBCEF is given below:-

 - One Dy. Commandant,
 - One Medical Officer,
 - > Two Company Commanders,
 - Three Asst. Company Commanders,
 - > 34 Platoon Commanders.
 - > 101 Section Commanders.

Nature of Duty:

Rescue and relief operation during flood and water related disaster in flood prone districts of West Bengal (In 1981 they also undertook the same duties in Orissa and in the years 1983 to 1987 during flood in Assam) and during Gangasagar Mela every year.

- Fire Fighting duty under supervision of WBFS (Stephen Court fire accident-2009, AMRI fire accident-2012, Surya Sen market fire accident-2013 etc.)
- Hospital duty at different hospitals of Kolkata under supervision of concerned Medical Officers during strike and emergency.
- Kolkata Corporation duty and Kolkata port duty during strike and emergency.
- Bengal Thermal Plant duty during strike and emergency.
- R/T transmission and operation duty under supervision of Irrigation Department.

■ Water Wing Civil Defence:

- Started functioning in the year 1978 during devastating flood with the help of 332 boats and OBMs.

Standing Order for WBECF and WWCD:

The Water Wing Civil Defence and West Bengal Civil Emergency Force personnel along with Boats, OBMs & other accessories are deployed in the flood prone Districts of West Bengal in order to conduct emergency flood rescue and relief operation duty.

- a) All the INF Boats & OBMs are checked and serviced and certified to be fit for deployment by 15th May every year.
- b) Each INF Boat and OBM are carried & operated by 3 (three) Personnel.
- c) The personnel deployed are equipped with life saving devices such as Life buoys, Life lines, Life Jackets, First Aid kits. All the life saving equipment are checked & certified to be fit for use by 15th May 2014.
- d) In case of emergency, affected districts will be provided with additional man power, Boats & OBM on requisition from District Magistrate & Controller of Civil Defence of respective districts with intimation to the Commandant.
- e) The said deployment are commenced on and from 1st June and continue up to 31st October. The deployment are at made in 3 batches, each for 45 days duration.
- f) The District Magistrate and Controller of Civil Defence will have liberty to split up the camps with resource at different places at their disposal and after taking into consideration all facts and advise by the concerned authorities.
- g) All the South Bengal Districts Authorities collect their Boats & OBMs from Store & Workshop at 109/1, Beliaghata Main Road, Kolkata 10 by their own transport arrangements positively by 25th May 2014 and return all Boats & OBMs when emergency period is over by their own arrangements.
- h) All the North Bengal District Authorities collect their Boats & OBMs from Central Training Institute, Gotlu, Itahar, and Uttar Dinajpur by their own transport arrangement positively by 25th May 2014 and return the said Boats & OBMs after emergency period is over.
- i) Mechanics are to be provided on requisition by the District authorities to the Commandant, WWCD (W.B.).
- j) The fuel for OBMS to be provided by the District Authorities at the time of operation as per requisition of Party in Charge/Operators.
- k) All the District Authorities will provide adequate accommodation for Boats & OBMs and man power separately.
- I) District Magistrate & Controllers of Civil Defence are requested to send the requirement of further deployment as and when situation demands for consideration.

DEPLOYMENT OF WWCD AND WBCEF PERSONNEL FOR GANGASAGAR MELA DUTY:

Every year traditionally the Gangasagar mela is being organised by West Bengal Govt. at the confluence of the river Ganges and Bay of Bengal on the day of MAKAR SANKRANTI. It is the 2nd largest congregation of Hindu pilgrims after the holy Kumbha Mela in India, lakhs of pilgrims from different parts of the country and abroad has come here for holy bath and offer puja to Kapil Muni Temple. Gangasagar is a Island and there only two entry point at the mainland side of the river Ganges i.e. LOT -8 and Namkhana point. Where Water Wing Civil Defence and WBCEF personnel have been monitoring vessels, RT duty, marshalling of pilgrims and continuous watching of aqua field by INF boat respectively every year. On the other side i.e. Island side there are three entry points Chemaguri, Kachuberia and newly taken Henry Point Where this twin organisation and Civil Defence volunteer force work side by side along with the district administration. At the Sagar Point water Wing Civil Defence, WBCEF, Volunteer force discharge round the clock duties in sea water with INF boats, they also performed RT and Control Centre at Mela Office. Actually the people who ensure the safe journey of the pilgrims.

Regional Civil Defence Control Centre (RCDCC):

This unit after receiving the warning from Air Defence Directing Centre(ADDC) transmit the same to a number of Town Civil Defence Controls (TCDC) depending on RCDCC through a specially built P&T telephone net work as well as through high frequency radio net. Actually the responsibility of RCDCC is to disseminate information collected from ADDC via radar to its region of the country. Such as Kolkata RCDCC is meant for eastern region.

- ➡ Regional Civil Defence Control Centre (RCDCC), Kolkata formerly known as Regional Warning Centre (RWC) was established in 1963 in the wake of Chinese aggression.
- In our State there are three RCDCCs at Kolkata, Siliguri and Hashimara.
- ➡ The Region covered by the Kolkata are the southern part of West Bengal, whole of Odisha and Jharkhand.
- RCDCCs are defunct now.
- Few old sirens installed in Kolkata are working.
- ▶ E-tendering is done for Wireless Automated Siren System (WARS) to replace the old and defunct siren system.
- Need to be replaced the defunct RCDCC by advance, fast, reliable and cost effective system.
- Installation of Wireless Automated Remote System (WARS) in different places at Kolkata RCDCC ,Sundarbans area and DVC catchment area for better monitoring about every moment information regarding any hazardous situation likely to be occurred. E-tendering is done for this modern Siren System (WARS) to replace the old and defunct siren system.

■ Civil Defence Services:

There are 12 CD services. The functions of important CD services are as follows:-

- **Headquarters service**: In large metropolitan cities a whole time Controller is provided and in smaller towns the Controller is formed from existing organization.
- Communication Service: This service performs three functions: i) Receipt and disseminate of information regarding any natural or manmade calamity.(ii) Receipt and evaluate damage report at control centre. (iii) Communication between wardens post, control / sub Control centre etc.
- Warden Service: It is the link between the public and authorities and eyes and ear of the organisation.
- Casualty Service: Function of this service are (i) Rendering first-aid on the spot. (ii) Providing transport to casualty for short distance. (iii) Send serious casualty for further medication. A medical officer has been authorised as in charge.
- Fire-Fighting Service: This consists of house fire parties. They detect small fires.
- **Training Service**: To conduct training on different issues related to disaster.

- **Rescue Service:** Their duties are to rescue the casualties trapped under derbies and recover the dead from damaged buildings.
- **Depot & Transport Service**: This service is intended to despatch C.D services to the affected localities in a short time.
- **Supply Service:** This service is responsible for:- a) Planning, organising and procuring necessary equipments for CD services. (b) Proper storage and quick distribution of the equipment at the time of need.
- **Salvage Service**: After damage the property left behind is salvaged and kept in safe custody by the members of this service.
- Welfare Service: The function of this service is (a) To supply information regarding missing relatives, dead etc. (b) To provide rest centres. Temporary shelters, food and clothing's. (c) To arrange evacuation.
- Corpse Disposal Service: At the scene of damage human bodies are required to be collected, identified and cleared from the Police and Medical practitioner before these are disposed off.

■ Enrolment Drive all over West Bengal:

In an attempt to make the Civil Defence Organisation in the State, hitherto limited to CD Towns only, more broad-based and to take it down to the grass roots level and, most significantly, to ensure that the community becomes an effective first responder in the event of any natural / manmade calamity / disaster, the following procedures have already been initiated

All the D.M. & Controllers of Civil Defence have been asked to ensure that Our target is to enrol CDVs @ 1% of the total population of the state i.e. nearly nine lakh.

A) In every Municipal Town:

- 20 volunteers are to be enrolled per Ward.
- ➤ In addition there would be 2 Sector Wardens and 1 Post Warden per Ward who would report to a Deputy Divisional Warden in the Ward.
- Deputy Divisional Wardens would report to a Divisional Warden who would head a contiguous area covering 4-5 Wards.

B) In every Corporation:

- > 50 volunteers are enrolled per Ward.
- ➤ In addition there would be 2 Sector Wardens and 1 Post Warden per Ward who would report to a Deputy Divisional Warden in the Ward.
- Deputy Divisional Wardens would report to a Divisional Warden who would head a contiguous area covering 2-3 Wards.

C) In Every Panchayat:

- ➤ Should have 12 volunteers, 2 Sector Wardens and 1 Post Warden.
- > 2-3 GPs would be under a Deputy Divisional Warden
- > There would be one Divisional Warden in each Block who would report to the BDO cum Asst. Controller of Civil Defence.
- > All the Deputy Divisional Wardens would report to the Divisional Warden.

Formation of QUICK RESPONCE TEAMS (QRT):

- ▶ It has been noticed that lot of time passes before rescue and search teams can reach the spot. This happens primarily on account of the fact that there are no dedicated personnel who could be pressed into service at short notice as well as lack of appropriate equipment. It is necessary to have a dedicated team of personnel for deployment with modern equipments.
- These should be barrack based to enable ready deployment at short notice.
- Adequate quantum of suitable equipment of appropriate quality.

QRT in District Level:

A unit of 40 personnel along with

- One fully equipped CDRV
- One Mini CDRV
- One Jeep and
- > One Motor Cycle

are made available in each District HQrs. to enable the DM & Controller of Civil Defence to effectively tackle in minimum time as first responder any calamity/disaster that may strike his District.

The Controllers of Civil Defence shall appoint one of the Senior S.O.I.s as the Officer—in-Charge of the QRTs, and the equipment thereof. This officer shall be responsible for the QRTs being in perfect condition and for their effective deployment.

QRT in Sub-Division Level:

A unit of 20 personnel would be deployed in one of the outlying and vulnerable subdivision along with

- One Mini CDRV and
- > One Motor Cycle

to enable further decentralisation of effective intervention. This shall be taken up in the 2nd phase and as part of the roll out.

QRT in Hill Areas:

As a CDRV shall be difficult to operate in the Hills, deployment of CDRV may not be possible in Darjeeling, which shall be located in Siliguri. In cases of extreme emergencies, Darjeeling Hills may be catered to by this CDRV. However, to ensure adequate coverage for the 3 hill subdivisions of Darjeeling hills, it is proposed to have 4 Mini CDRVs, with 2 stationed in Darjeeling and the other 2 at Kalimpong and Kurseong, with higher level of support equipment and 1 Mini CDRV at Siliguri. Each Mini CDRV shall be supported by 20 personnel. There shall also be a Jeep each for Darjeeling as well as Siliguri, and a Motor Cycle for each of the 4 sub -divisions.

QRT in Kolkata

To enable the Collector for Kolkata & Controller of Civil Defence to effectively tackle any calamity/disaster that may strike his District, a unit of 40 personnel along with 1 CDRV shall be available for deployment with his office and 20 personnel along with one fully equipped Mini CDRV along with a Jeep and 1 Motor Cycle should be made available in each Sub Area.

Reserve QRT:

There would be reserves along with the 2 available CDRVs at Kolkata along with 1 Trauma Ambulance along with suitably trained staff under the control of the Director, Civil Defence for centralised deployment in case of emergencies.

Similarly reserves in man and equipment in the form of 1 CDRV and 1 Trauma Ambulance would be available for deployment in the North Bengal and Paschimanchal area at Siliguri and Asansol respectively under the control of the Director, Civil Defence.

CDRVs for QRT:

In order to minimise response time in the event of any disaster striking in all over West Bengal covering all the 19 Districts including Kolkata. The following CDRVs, Personal Protective Equipments(PPE) and modern rescue equipments have been procured by the Deptt. and already handed over to all DMs and Controller of Civil Defence in the state including Kolkata by Hon'ble CM West Bengal with a view to minimise the response time to any disaster occurred in the dist. The rescue operation in the district will be operated by the QRT members those who have undergone the Camp based Training at WBNVF Camp, Kalyani, Nadia without waiting for outside help.

Standard Operating Procedure(SOP)

Civil Defence Organisation and its services are basically based on volunteers and they generally come and enrolled from all corner of the society and habitation. After completion of certain procedure and training they are considered as volunteer, and either on the basis of their performances for some consecutive years or considering his prominence and leadership quality in his locality they are selected as Sector Warden and they are supposed to keep every information of 4000 people in his locality. Altogether one Warden post and Post Warden is formed upon five Sector Warden i.e. on 20000 population and one division is formed generally consisting with 10 warden Post i.e on 200000 population. So these Wardens usually get the first information of any incident occurred in his locality and immediately inform to the Control Centre manned round the clock 81/2/2 Phears Lane. Control Centre informs higher authority to get the decision towards deployment of QRT with CDRVs and other CD services, WWCD, WBCEF (as required) to the incident spot with minimum respond time. But in maximum cases Disaster Management Department Govt. of West Bengal directly inform about early warning to the Director of Civil Defence or any superior officer about any disaster. Sometimes Metrological Deptt. also send information.

In case of manmade flood situation like Purba Medinipur, Paschim Medinipur, Howrah and Hooghly in the last year following sudden release of huge water from DVC and Galudi barrages, WWCD and WBCEF personnel directed to move immediately with Boats and OBMs and conduct rescue works under the guideline of the local administration. From last year Civil Defence volunteer having the art of good swimming @ 2 are being deployed per boats to expedite the rescue operation with WWCD & WBCEF personnel.

In case of any spreading or sudden break out dieses the Casualty Service comprising with senior doctors and good first-aiders is deployed.

For Kolkata 15 nos. QRT members (CDV) ten for big CDRV and five for small CDRV fully loaded with modern equipments have been stationed and always kept ready at CCDTI WB, 199 NSC Bose Rd. Surya Nagar, Kolkata-40 along with three drivers two for big CDRV and one for small CDRV they will performed round the clock duty to respond to any sorts of disaster within shortest possible time.

Another Troup of QRT comprising of 40 members have been kept ready with two big CDRVs fully loaded with Modern Rescue Equipments at WBCEF Camp 106, Carry Road, Howrah-3, the camp is also functioning as Multi Disciplinary Centre for entire South Bengal. In the recent past this Troup has rendered commendable service in Surya Sen Market Fire, Kalbaisakhi-2013, fire accident at Sankrail, Howrah etc. along with the dedicated volunteers of West Bengal Civil Defence.

Task accomplished and planed

- 1. Target to conduct training at local level i.e. CD foundation course and Basic Wardens Course at least twice in a month.
- 2. The target strength of volunteers will have to raised upto four lakh.
- 3. Minimum twenty different training courses on different subject will be held at CCDTI, WB including Modern Equipments.
- 4. Multi disciplinary centres made operational at Asansole and Siliguri.
- 5. Civil Defence Rescue Centres at Basirhat, North 24 Parganas and Mohanpur, Paschim Medinipur have started functioning like Pursurah, Hooghly.
- 6. A team of volunteers having the training on Modern Equipments, Firs-Aid and Fire Fighting are always kept ready at control centre to combat and minimize the effect of any sorts of disaster.
- 7. Steps are to be taken to build up an updated control centre at the Office of the Director of Civil Defence, West Bengal, 81/2/2 Phears Lane, Kolkata -12.
- 8. Regional Civil Defence control centre, Kolkata will be modernized. The catchments areas of DVC, Sundarbans and Coastal areas of Purba Medinipur, South 24 Parganas and Kolkata will be covered with modern

- communication system to receive and disseminate warning of any whether forecast of disaster by WARS (Wireless Automated Remote Sirens System). Necessary e-Tender floated and accepted.
- 9. Insurance coverage for the volunteers engaged in different disaster could made possible in Kolkata area.
- 10. Issuance and introduction of Identity Card to the volunteers throughout the State Proposed.
- 11. Camp based Multi-disciplinary training programme at least with one hundred volunteers from each district proposed.
- 12. Data base of CDVs and QRT members of West Bengal will be accomplished.
- 13. Civil Defence setup are being made district centric to town centric.
- 14. Target of procurement of more boats, OBMs, Modern Equipments and PPE for the purpose of Rescue. Modern Equipments and PPE for rescue (funds source SDRF) and AMC (Funds source Disaster Management, WB) to the tune of Rs. 6,77,000,00/- and 30,000,00/- respectively purchased / done through eTender.
- 15. Training to the Nulias (Those engaged in rescue on Sea Shore) at Digha for watching the tourists during the time of Sea bath.
- 16. QRT barrack will be built up all the districts. Seven districts have been allotted fund.
- 17. Small vehicles and Troup Carrier will be purchased for smooth functioning of office and operational works.
- 18. A vigilance team comprising of officers dealing with the subject has been formed at Civil Defence Directorate. The team will start visiting the districts and hold short inspection in respect of CDRVs and render all necessary assistance to revamp the activities of Civil Defence.
 On 20/05/2014 and 23/05/2014 this team visited Coach Behar and Uttar Dinajpur where mock drills for all the 6 drills of North Bengal held and newly procured Modern Equipments and PPEs handed over to them.
- 19. The huge no. of vacancies in the rank of Sr. SOI, SOI being the backbone of the organization exist proposal for filling up such vacancies will be initiated afresh.
- 20. Creation of New Sub-Areas of Civil Defence in newly created Police Commissionerate.
- 21. Director office set-up as per compendium in West Bengal.
- 22. Enrolment of NVF volunteers as CD QRT Teams in all districts and Kolkata.
- 23. Filling up the vacant post of Dy. Controllers of CD, HQRs.
- 24. Arrangement of a building for accommodation of officers, staff and apparatus at Bankura.
- 25. Creation of Whole time Controller of CD, Kolkata and sanction of SOIs etc. for Director of Civil Defence, West Bengal.
- 26. Vacancy position of Water Wing Civil Defence (WWCD) and West Bengal Civil Emergency Force (WBCEF).
- 27. Recruitment / enrolment of WBNVF (1520) to act as QRT members.
- 28. The new Administrative Buildings of WWCD at WBNVF, Kalyani is ready for shifting.
- 29. The WWCD and WBCEF personnel with boats and life saving equipments did splendid job during Gangasagar Mela 2014.
